I couldn't be prouder of how our athletes, coaches, volunteers and donors remained positive and motivated throughout it all. We have emerged a stronger, unified and more impactful movement!

Despite all that 2020 threw at us, we were still able to accomplish the following:

- We hosted 45 virtual programs from Healthy Athletes and Family Health Forums to sports skills and fitness classes to cooking classes and more.
- We met with our Louisiana delegation in the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate to successfully lobby for increased funding for health and education.
- We hosted five state competitions, one of which was virtual, to keep athletes engaged, active and healthy. Limited in-person events were held, including some flag football practices and softball skills competition, but only where and when social distancing and safety protocols could be strictly enforced.
- We also increased our online resources to offer all athletes and families tools to live a happy, healthy and active life always.

For every time we heard from our athletes about loneliness and fear, there were tenfold stories about resilience, bravery and perseverance. We learned more than ever that SOLA is family to so many – a place where our athletes come to find acceptance, hope, joy and empowerment. SOLA is a place where there are no boundaries on what they can and will achieve!

To everyone who supported us in 2020, thank you for standing by us at a time when we needed your belief and investment in us the most. We are deeply grateful. Special Olympics Louisiana is here to stay as we continue to create a revolution that demands acceptance, understanding, respect and inclusion for people with and without intellectual disabilities. We will create a more compassionate and peaceful world where everyone has a chance to shine.


